The third article is about experiment of M. Abed Al-Jabiri’s post-structuralism approach. M. Abed Al-Jabiri is an Islamic philosophical thinker. He criticizes Islamic and Arabic reasoning. This article is written by Mohamad Anas. In his article, he tries to apply Al-Jabiri approach in the context of Indonesian society.

Lery Prasetyo writes the next article, the fourth article. He writes article entitled “The Spiritual and Cultural Symbols in a Mahayana Buddhist Temple ‘Vihara Lotus’ Surakarta.” This article aims to analyze the meaning and value of spiritual and cultural symbols in Vihara Lotus Surakarta. The point can be learnt from this article is that the concepts of Vihara Lotus in Surakarta as the mixed (syncretism) from the originally teaching of Buddha of India and the China culture, and also the Indonesian culture.
